

**ADMINISTRATIVE AND GENERAL INSTRUCTION FOR**  
**9<sup>th</sup> ALL INDIA INDIGENOUS HORSE SHOW AND ENDURANCE RIDE**  
**CHAMPIONSHIP: 2015-16 ON 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> DEC. 2016 AT DUNDLOD AND**  
**5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> DEC. 2016 AT JAIPUR, (RAJASTHAN)**

**General**

1. The All India Indigenous Horse and Endurance Championship, under the aegis of Equestrian Federation of India.
2. Dundlod is 150 Kms from Jaipur on the road towards Sikar / Jhunjhunu.
3. The following All India Indigenous Horse and Endurance Ride Championships Classes will be held:-
  - (a) The 40,60, 80, and 120 Kms Endurance Ride Championship for riders above 16 years as per EFI and FEI regulations.
  - (b) In all competitions the Marwari, Kathiawari, Sindhi, and Indigenous half bred Horses will be eligible for the championship.
  - (c) The competitions will be conducted as per FEI and EFI Technical Guidelines. List of events is as per Appx 'A' and tentative schedule is as per Appx 'B'.

**Registration**

**HORSES & SENIOR PARTICIPANTS**

4. All competitors are required to register themselves and their horses with the IHSI before they arrive at the show venue. A fee of Rs.500/- must be paid to the IHSI along with the details of the horses to be registered and Rs 500/- for issue of Horse Passport/Registration to EFI. The details to be provided for Registration and Passport are:
  - (a) Name
  - (b) Year of Foaling
  - (c) Sex, Breed, Colour
  - (d) Identification Marks
  - (e) Disciplines participating in
  - (f) Owner/Organisation/Club/Institute's name
5. All registration fees have to be sent to the IHSI with full details of the Horse before 10<sup>th</sup> November 2016, after which registration may be done at location on payment of additional fee of Rs. 200 /-Every participating horse must have a IHSI registration and EFI passport.

**Entries &Entry Fee**

6. Entries will only be accepted after the payment of entry fee which will be as follows:

(a) Team events	Rs.1000 per team
(b) Individual	Rs.500 per exhibit
7. Entries will be closed by 15<sup>th</sup> NOVEMBER, 2016 the entries received after that date will be regarded as post entries.
8. **Entries will only be accepted in the prescribed format as attached.**
9. **Soft copy of entries to be forwarded by email or courier CD. These will be TENTATIVE ENTRIES.**

**10. Final entries will only be considered on payment of entry fees before 15 Nov. 2016 or One hour before the commencement of First Veterinary Inspection.**

**Post Entries**

11. The post entries fees are Rs.1000 per individual and Rs.2000 per team.
12. After 15 Nov.2016 all entries will be considered as post entries. Post entries will be accepted up to 01 hours before the scheduled time of the First Veterinary Inspection of the event.
13. All payment will be made to **RAJASTHAN EQUESTRIAN ASSOCIATION** through bank draft payable at JAIPUR or cash for which receipt will be issued. No Cheques will be accepted. Entries will not be accepted without payment and IHSI / EFI Registration number and Passport of horses.
14. All entries will be made on the prescribed specimen performa attached and sent to the show Secretary Ms. Sunayana Mishra, Dundlod Fort, Dundlod- 333702, Dist. Jhunjhunu Rajasthan.
15. The entry fee of a horse entered for any event will not be refunded if the horse does not participate in the event unless it has been withdrawn on veterinary ground. Veterinary certificate must be obtained from the official veterinarians.

**Change of rider:**

16. Rider cannot be changed unless the jury accepts that there are sufficient reasons for the change of rider.

**Restriction on Rider:**

17. A rider can participate in one team only.

**Rejection of Entry:**

18. The Rajasthan Equestrian Association ( REA) Horse show organising committee reserves the right to reject any entry without assigning any reasons.

**Cancellation of classes:**

19. The organising committee reserves the right to cancel any class and in such a case the entry fee shall be refunded.

**Reporting for Each Class:**

20. All animals will report to the collecting ring stewards half an hour before the time of start. Any competitor not reporting at the appointed time will be scrapped unless the exhibitor shows good cause for the delay to the satisfaction of the Ground jury. All horses will proceed from the collecting ring to the judging ring under the charge of the collecting ring steward concerned. No horse will move independently.

**Show Number:**

21. Each horse will wear an EFI allotted show number

**Judging:**

22. Decision of the President Ground Jury shall be final unless altered on appeal under rules.

**Objections:**

23. Objections may be lodged by the team Captain / Competitor within one hour before commencement of the event and not later than half an hour after announcement of the result. A fee of Rs. 2000 in cash will accompany the objection and will be refunded if the objection is upheld. The decision of the Jury will be final in all cases.

**Responsibility:**

24. The Committee accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury to animals or any other property of the exhibitors themselves through accidents or any cause.

**Insurance:**

25. The Organising Committee / Technical Committee recommends the units/clubs/associations to take their own insurance policies for competitors, personnel, grooms, and horses for their transport to Dundlod during the events. Neither the organising Committee nor the Technical committee will assume any responsibility for any accident or illness due to fall of any horse, competitor, groom or any other member of the team/contingent.

**Disqualification:**

26. The Jury/TD/Stewards are empowered to disqualify a competitor at any stage of the competition for rough handling or any form of cruelty to animals or any other reason, which they feel justified. They will submit written reports of **such incidents** to REA at the end of the competition.

**Questions not provided for:**

27. Should any question arise that is not provided for in these rules, it must be referred to the Jury whose decision shall be final.

**Description of Exhibits:**

28. All entries must have a description, name and IHSI / EFI Registration & Passport number of horses for the official programme.

**Correspondence:**

29. All communication should be addressed to the Show Secretary“ Ms. Sunayana Mishra, Dundlod Fort, Dundlod -333702, Dist. Jhunjhunu Rajasthan. It would be advisable to send entry forms, drafts and other important communication by registered” post marked Immediate / Priority so as to avoid delay and loss in transit.

**Camp Arrangements:**

30. The horses and riders participating in the Endurance competition will stay in the camp, which will be located at Dundlod near the competition area. The camp will start functioning with effect from 28<sup>th</sup> November 2016. Contingents will ensure that they do not reach the camp before 28<sup>th</sup> November 2016, they will ensure that suitable arrangements for the return journey are made by them in time since the camp will close down on 03<sup>rd</sup> December 2016.

The camp at Jaipur for all other events will start functioning from the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2016 and close down on the 7<sup>th</sup> December 2016.

31. The Camp Incharge will earmark site for each contingent. The Manager of the contingent will take over the site allotted to them from the camp incharge on arrival and hand them over before departure in the same condition. Any damage to camp, accommodation or property will be the responsibility of the Manager of the contingent. The teams should come self-contained for camping of their personnel and animals.

32. All teams will intimate the total strength of contingent in terms of men and horses by 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2016.

**Accommodation:**

33. A camping site will be provided in the camp area. However, the teams / individuals should be self-sufficient in stabling facilities. Contingents are advised to be self-sufficient in ration / supplies both for men and animals. Details of various hotels will be provided on demand and bookings can be made directly.

**Practice And Exercise Area:**

34. A suitable area will be earmarked close to the camp for exercise and practice of horses/ riders participating in the competition.

**Lighting:**

35. All contingents are requested to bring their own hurricane lanterns / petromax for use during an emergency. Though power/electric supply will be provided under camp arrangements. No unauthorized electric connections will be permitted. Any accidents due to electrocution will be the responsibility of Manager of the contingent.

**Ration For Animals:**

36. All contingents are requested to bring their own ration for animals. In case of shortage, barley can be made available on cash payment from the REPC stables. Fodder and Green grass will be provided on payment. Requirement should be made in writing in advance. Centralized water arrangements will be made. Contingents must bring sufficient buckets and container to store and water their animals.

**Transport:**

37. The contingents will contact the camp incharge and transport can be provided subject to availability on direct payment to the transporter.

**Line Gear For Animals:**

38. All participants will bring adequate line-gear, picketing gear and animal rugs (Jhools) with them, Repair of saddlery and line gear will be carried out under the arrangements of the contingents.

**Litter Disposal**

39. Dumping area for litter will be earmarked. All participants / Managers will be responsible to keep their camping area clean and dispose off dung on daily basis.

**Pitching Of Tents:**

40. Contingents are advised to come prepared to pitch their own tents under their own arrangements on the area allocated to them.

**Fire Precaution:**

41. All contingent will be responsible for organizing their own fire fighting precautions of their respective areas.

**Security:**

42. All INDIVIDUALS, participants and contingents will ensure highest level of security of their contingents during their stay in the camp. All personals are warned to be extra vigilant and careful.

**Medical Facilities:**

43. Medical facilities will be provided by the Local hospital at Dundlod and Jaipur, the details of which will be available with the camp office at both locations.

**Veterinary Cover:**

44. Veterinary cover to animal in the camp will be provided under the arrangements of the Vet Government hospital in the area. On the ground, first aid and other veterinary facilities will be provided by the IHSI vet in attendance. All horses participating in the competition will have valid Coggins/CFT/Mallein Test certificates as per Vet policy in vogue.

**March Past And Flags:**

45. The teams will bring two flags of their teams. All teams will carry two flags each of their respective teams. The size of the flags will be 6'x4'. Teams will also handover their flags meant for flying on the show ground immediately on arrival to Camp In-charge. Hence, each team should be in possession of two flags each.

**Foreign Participation:**

Foreign participation is allowed in this championship to popularize the Indigenous breeds as endurance horses and to encourage and develop the sport of Endurance in India.

Limited Indigenous horses can be made available on hire basis on first come first serve basis to interested riders.

The entry for this must be sent by the 5<sup>th</sup> of November 2016 to make proper arrangements.

Boarding and Lodging arrangements will be available at Heritage hotels on payment.
