General Conditions

1. The Identity Document is issued to ensure that a horse can be identified at all times. It must always accompany the horse.
2. Each recipient must check the identity of the horse from the Markings/Brand Marks contained in the Identity Document and check the remaining information before endorsing acceptance. Discrepancies should be reported immediately to the Indigenous Horse Society of India.
3. The Identity Document of an animal must be returned to the Indigenous Horse Society of India when the horse dies or is destroyed.
4. The Identity Document is not a Deed of Ownership.
5. If the Identity Document is lost, the loss must be notified to the Indigenous Horse Society of India.
6. A duplicate Identity Document will be issued by Indigenous Horse Society of India on receipt of an application stating why a duplicate is required.
7. A duplicate Identity Document to replace the lost original will be issued on payment of Rs. 500/-.
8. The Identity Document contains the following information:
 - a. Markings/Brand Marks on a diagrammatic form
 - b. Ownership details
 - c. Covering details (to be filled by the Breeder)
 - d. Movements

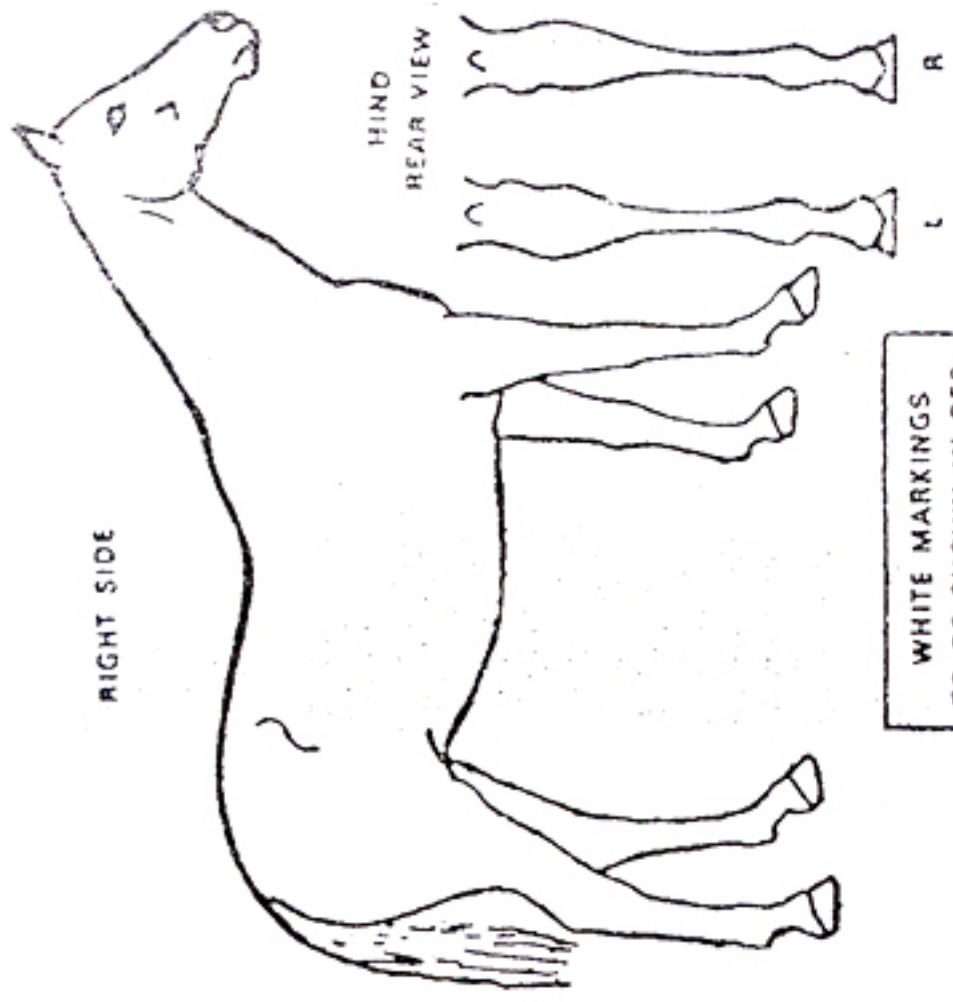

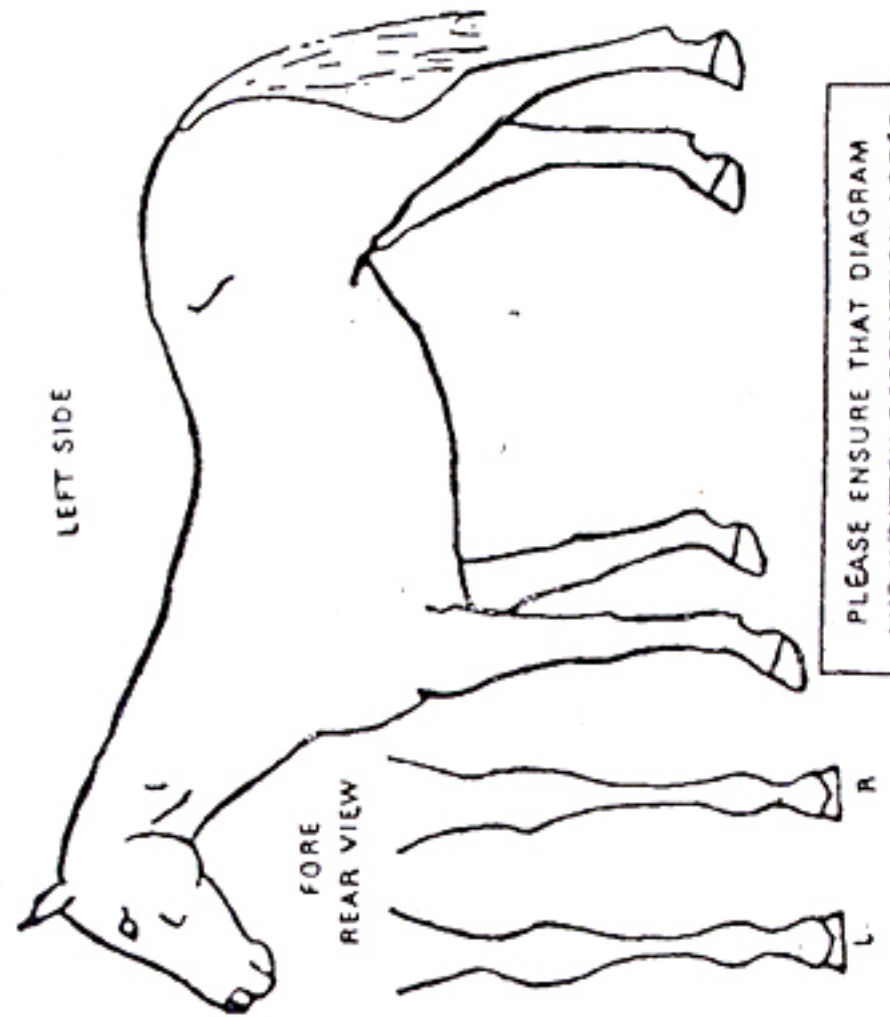
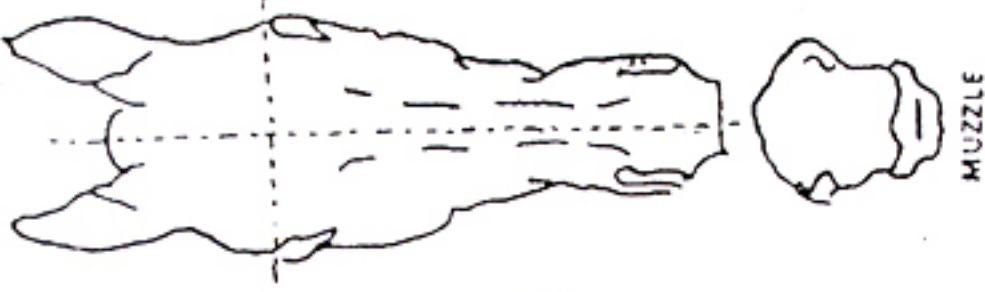

Action by Breeders

1. When a change of ownership occurs, the same should be inserted in the Identity Document on the appropriate page quoting the authority of Indigenous Horse Society of India letter.
2. Notify the Indigenous Horse Society of India of any markings acquired by the horse or any change in coat color or in the brand marks.
3. In the interest of the Breeders/Studs, it is recommended that as far as possible they should not accept any animal without its Identity Document or Passport.
4. Ensure that the Identity Document accompanies a Mare/Stallion whenever they travel.
5. If a Stud Farm/Purchaser does not receive the Identity Document from the selling party despite reminders, a duplicate Identity Document will be issued and a sum of Rs. 1000/- charged to the seller.
6. This Document must be produced for inspection when required by an Official of the Indigenous Horse Society of India.
